BUSINESS TRANSACTED AT THE FINAL SESSIONS. Formal Expression of the Delegates on the Death of President McKinley—Rev. J. Randolph to Be Reported to the Synod for Being Absent and Unexcused from the Conference—Paper by Rev. J. J. Kuntz on "Is Our Present Mode of Election Satisfactory?"

The final sessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Ministerium were held yesterday at St. Mark's church. The morning devotional services were conducted by Rev. E. J. Kenning.

The committee on the president's report reported as follows: We have learned with much pleasure of the cordial unity throughout our conference during the past six months and pray that the great Head of the Church may in the future also guide us in our efforts and bless our work.

We express to Rev. E. J. Kenning our sincere sympathy in the loss he has sustained in the death of his wife, praying that God will comfort him in his sad bereavement.

We also regret the recent death of Mr. E. W. Lennertz, an active laborer of our church, and the president of the Northern District Lutheran League.

It was moved that a committee of two be appointed to make nominations for the various synodical boards. The chair appointed Rev. W. M. Rohrig and Rev. J. H. Kuntz.

Rev. J. J. Kuntz read a paper on the subject, "Is Our Present Mode of Election at Synod Satisfactory?" It was resolved to continue the discussion of this paper till the next meeting of conference.

Rev. J. J. Kuntz reported on the memorial volume. The report was received and ordered to be spread on the minutes.

It was resolved that a roll-call be made at the beginning of next conference and that every pastor be requested to give a statement of his apportionment, both retrospectively and prospectively.

THE APPOINTMENT. The committee on apportionment reported its work of apportioning the respective amounts to the several parishes on the approved minutes of the Ministerium of Pennsylvania. It was resolved to leave the question of selecting a place for next meeting in the hands of officers of the conference.

On motion it was ordered that the case of Rev. J. Randolph be reported to synod as having been absent and unexcused for two successive meetings of the conference previous to this convention. Rev. C. J. Cooper, of Allentown, was accorded the privilege of the floor of the conference.
