WINANS HULL IS ON TRIAL. MUCH TROUBLE MET IN SECURING A JURY.

Wayne County Men Have Either a Fixed Opinion About the Guilt of the Accused, or They Refuse Absolutely to Convict on Circumstantial Evidence—Panel Was Exhausted After Four Jurors Were Secured, and a New Panel of Sixty Jurors Has Been Ordered.

What the developments of the first day indicate will be one of the most celebrated cases in the history of Wayne county courts, opened in the court house in Honesdale yesterday, when Winans Hull, of Carbondale, the young man who is accused of slaying Edith Schoonover, in the woods near Lake Lodore, on June 28 last, was placed on trial for his life.

The story of the first day is the simplest kind of skirmish between counsel, which parties, who had determined battle to destroy or preserve the life of Hull. It was over the selection of the jury that counsel waged their efforts ending in the exhaustion of a panel of forty-eight jurors. This was the result at 2:30 in the afternoon, when but four jurors were agreed on. They are: Dr. Sanford Niles, dentist, Pleasant Mount; B. F. Eldred, farmer, Damascus; Charles E. Kelly, brewer, Hawley; Marshall E. Hayley, shoemaker, Texas.

Judge George S. Purdy, when the panel was exhausted, directed an order for a new panel of sixty jurors, who will be on hand at the opening of court this morning, when the contest will be renewed.

THE FIRST MOVE. The feature of the day was the effort of Attorney John J. Murphy, of Hull's counsel, to have the indictment against the defendant quashed, on the ground that there was not a full panel of jurors, one, Charles Bellman, of Hawley, not being present.
