Number of Collectors Turned in Money Yesterday.

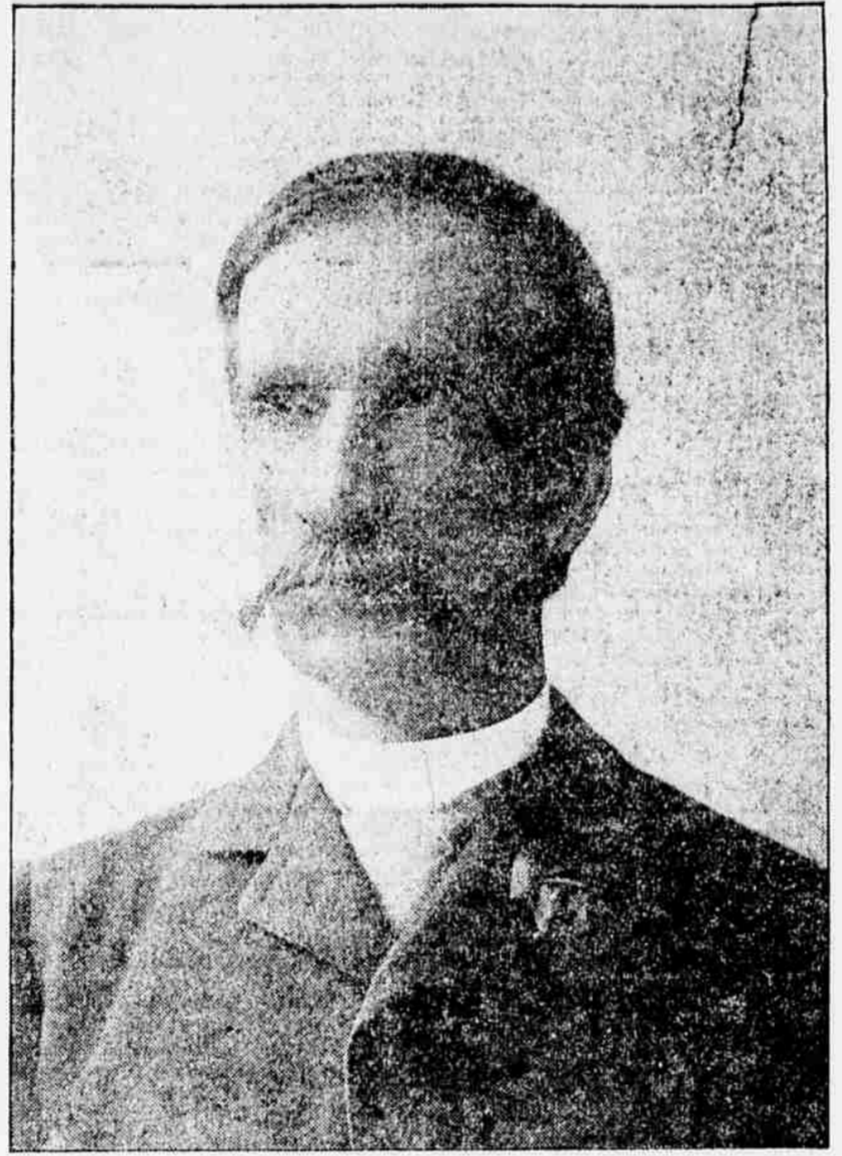
