The final schedule of assessments appropiating the cost of the North Main avenue and Providence road have among the property owners along those thoroughfares was filed yesterday by City Treasurer Robinson by Director of Public Works today.

DIVISION OF MAYFIELD. Court Approves Outlines of Wards, Appoints Election Officers and Names Polling Places. Court yesterday made an order dividing the borough of Mayfield into wards, in accordance with the report of the commissioners filed some time ago, specified the number of councilmen and school directors in each ward and when they are to be elected, specifying the place where elections shall be held and naming the judges and inspectors of election in each ward.

FIRST WARD. Beginning at the extreme westerly corner of the said borough of Mayfield, thence following the southerly boundary of said borough, which said boundary divides the said borough from the borough of Jerome, thence along said boundary line about ten thousand two hundred feet to the westerly corner of the intersection of Poplar street; thence along said Poplar street to a point in the northwesterly corner of the said borough, thence in a westerly direction to the place of beginning. To constitute one ward to be known as the first ward of the borough of Mayfield.

SECOND WARD. All that portion of the said borough beginning at the easterly corner of Poplar street at its intersection with the First ward, thence easterly along the said Poplar street seven thousand five hundred feet to the westerly boundary of the said borough, thence along said boundary line about ten thousand two hundred feet to the westerly boundary of the said borough, thence in a westerly direction to the place of beginning. To constitute another ward, to be known as the second ward of the borough of Mayfield.

THIRD WARD. All that portion of the said borough included in the First and second wards, and beginning at the southerly corner of the said borough, thence along Walnut street easterly to the westerly boundary of the said borough, thence along said westerly boundary of the said borough four thousand two hundred feet to the northwesterly corner of the said borough, thence along said boundary line in a westerly direction two thousand five hundred feet to the place of beginning. To constitute another ward, to be known as the third ward of the borough of Mayfield.

FIRST WARD. The qualified electors of the First ward of the said borough shall elect two councilmen, one for two years and one for three years, and one school director for three years, at the next annual municipal election to be held in said borough.

SECOND WARD. The qualified electors of the second ward shall elect one councilman for three years and one school director for three years at the next annual municipal election to be held in said borough.

THIRD WARD. The qualified electors of the third ward shall elect one councilman for three years and one school director for three years, at the next annual municipal election to be held in said borough.

The contributions of synods to benevolence were as follows: Home missions, \$250,249; foreign missions, \$20,319; education, \$2,200; benevolence, \$26,000; church erection, \$2,292; relief fund \$28,520; freedmen, \$4,000; Sabbath school work, \$28,000; aid to colleges, \$15,322; general assembly, \$17,057; congregational, \$2,452,888; miscellaneous, \$2,179. The total contribution to the church by the synod during the year was \$3,374,220.
