But though it may have emanated from the census bureau, the press bulletin was not proof or even evidence. Newspaper bulletins are not evidence of anything.

QUESTION AT ISSUE. The question is not one of announcement, as the census bureau has not yet announced its decision on the part of the candidates or the electors.

IN VERY CLOSE CASES THIS FEATURE WOULD BECOME IMPORTANT. Nevertheless as an official act of a department of the government, the connection with congress, this was probably part of the public history of which not only the counts but the officers of election and electors are bound to take notice.

The act of June 27, 1895, P. L. 403, abolishes in counties of more than 100,000 population, the office of county auditor and requires the election of a county controller.

OPINION IN THE FEE CASE

IT WAS WRITTEN BY JUSTICE MITCHELL.

He Holds That the Census of Lackawanna County Was Not Legally Ascertained Until the Census Department Made Its Report to Congress—That Was on Dec. 13 and Could Not Affect the Office Holders Elected on Nov. 6. Full Text of the Opinion.

The opinion of Justice Mitchell, of the Supreme court, in the case is given below. This is the case that was decided at Philadelphia on October 11.

The case was brought by District Attorney W. H. Lewis to determine whether or not the county officers elected last November should receive fees of salary. The Supreme court decided that they are entitled to fees.

The decision is of great importance, as it applies to Lancaster and Westmoreland counties as well as Lackawanna, they, too, having passed into the class of counties having a population of over 100,000 with the publishing of the last census.

Mr. Lewis was represented by Attorney W. J. Hood in the court of this county and before the Supreme court. He was assisted in the oral argument before the Supreme court by John G. Johnson, of Philadelphia.

The county was represented by Attorney J. H. Burns. The opinion follows:
