Returns from the state assure the election of Frank G. Harris, Republican candidate for state treasurer, and Judge William Potter, Republican, for supreme court judge, over Elisha A. Coray, Jr., and Harmon Yerkes, of the Fusion ticket, by pluralities considerably below those given Treasurer Barnett in 1899.

Philadelphia, Nov. 5.—Returns from the state indicate the election of Frank G. Harris, Republican, for state treasurer, and William Potter, Republican, for supreme court justice by pluralities considerably below those of Barnett, Republican, had 110,585 plurality. The reduction of the Republican plurality is due in part to the light vote cast.
