**SHOULD BOOK UP ON SOCIOLOGY**

**PRIESTS ARE URGED TO STUDY IT CLOSELY.**

At the Annual Conference of the Clergy of the Scranton Diocese, Bishop Hoban dwells upon the Expediency of a Thorough Knowledge of This Science by Those Who Would Be Successful Leaders of Men—Independent Polish Priests Excommunicated.

Nearly all the priests of the Scranton diocese were present yesterday at St. Thomas college, in attendance upon the annual conference convened by Right Rev. Bishop Hoban. Many questions of importance and general interest were dealt with and an address was delivered by Bishop Hoban advising the priests in various ecclesiastical, social and political matters.

Among the things, the bishop urged upon the priests was that they make a close study of sociology. An intelligent understanding of this science, he said, was indispensable to those who are to be successful leaders of men. Conditions are such, now, he said, that the pastor is called upon frequently to deal directly with matters in which this science is immediately applied, and he should have a knowledge of it that would make him logically sure of any position he may in his judgment decide to take.

The bishop also issued a pronouncement against the independent parish priests. All of them he declared, whether real or bogus, were heretofore to be considered excommunicated and outside the pale of the church.

In a spirit of extreme intolerance the bishop withheld the benediction of excommunication for several years. Its issuance means that, in the eyes of the church, those priests are deprived of all their clerical functions and those who permit one of them to minister to them as a priest commits a sacrilege. Any marriage performed by one of them, for instance, would not be considered valid by the church.

**TWO PRIESTS AFFECTED.**

There are only two priests in this locality affected by the ban, Rev. Frank Hodur of South Scranton, and Rev. John Majrick, of Wilkes-Barre. They claimed affiliation with the Roman Catholic church, but refused to recognize the American bishop, taking their "oath," or commission, instead, from an "Independent Bishop" of Polish extraction, in Chicago, who claimed to have received episcopal functions in the old country.

Among the matters dealt upon by the bishop and submitted for discussion were the care of charitable institutions, the clerical relief fund and non-affiliated priests.

The election of six diocesan consultants, or members of the bishop's cabinet, resulted as follows: Rev. P. C. Nagle, of Wilkes-Barre; Rev. Benvenuto Gramerovic, of Nanticoke; Rev. P. J. Murphy, of Olyphant; Rev. P. J. McLaughlin, of Green Ridge; Rev. M. F. Crane, of Avoca; and Rev. T. J. Comerford, of Archbold. The first three were selected by the bishop; the second three were chosen by the priests, subject to the bishop's confirmation.

Five deacons were appointed by the bishop as follows:

Upper Luzerne—Rev. P. C. Nagle, of Wilkes-Barre.

Lower Luzerne—Rev. J. V. Huesle, of Hazleton.

Lycoming and Tioga—Rev. John Kowpoc, of Williamsport.

Bradford and Sullivan—Rev. Joseph Coroner, of Towanda.

Susquehanna—Rev. P. F. Broderick, of Susquehanna.

**POWERS OF DEANS.**

These deans have delegated to them certain episcopal powers in the matter of minor dispensations, and look after the welfare and conduct of the clergy in their respective dioceses, providing for their care when sick, arranging for their funerals, and reporting to the bishop any delinquencies that may occur among them.

Formerly there was only one dean, Rev. Father Nagle, who looked after the Germans and Poles. Bishop Hoban concluded upon increasing the number of deans to assign them according to geographical instead of racial divisions.

A year and a half ago, after a conference with the bishop and his consultants, the bishop announced a new temporary schedule of salaries for priests. An irremovable rector was to receive \$1,080 per year; other rectors, \$960, and assistant priests \$780. Out of this \$780, the assistant priest was to pay to the rector \$300 for board, lodging, etc. Yesterday the old board of consultants was convened prior to the priests' conference, and the new schedule fixed upon permanently.

Following the conference the priests enjoyed a dinner in St. Thomas college hall.

**RECITAL OF STUDENTS.**

Third of This Season Given in Guernsey Hall.

Last night there was a student recital at Guernsey hall, given by the Conservatory. It was the third of this season and the thirty-fifth of the school. The hall was soon filled and during the whole evening many were compelled to stand in the rear of the room; this seems to be a feature of the recitals of the Conservatory this year. The stage was furnished with a "baby grand" and three upright Sohmer pianos, and the first number, for an ensemble class, was given with two students at each. There is something very orchestral in work of this kind, and the audience seemed to enjoy it thoroughly.

A class of twelve came on by fours and played in any minor key asked for by the audience. I. e., transposed their pieces to the desired key, without knowing what it was to be. This was done by the first year students, who began at the Conservatory last September. The applause at this was most generous.

The solo work is deserving of mention, especially the "Vals Arabesque" by Franz Liszt, and the "Rhapsody" by Chopin in C minor by Mr. Wilkins, both of whom are advanced students. Misses Lewis, Newbauer, Kingsbury, Haas, Hodges and Brandt also gave evidence that there will soon be other advanced students. The next will be the artist recital by Constantine von Sternberg, at the Parish House, Jan. 7.
