PRESENT STATUS OF THE HARD COAL TRADE.

New Spring Price-List a Good Indication That There Will Not Be a Strike—Miners Want a Union Label on the Powder They Burn.

There will be no general strike at the mines this spring—the new spring price lists are a good indication of that.

That is, the various acts followed in such rapid succession as to preclude the idea that everything was unpremeditated.

The new price lists are expected to bring out a lot of orders, particularly from the west, where so many dealers last year, distrusting the permanency of the new order of things, delayed ordering until summer, and paid 30, 40 or 50c more a ton for the privilege.

Union Label on Powder. The members of the Local Union No. 1691, United Mine Workers of America, have passed a resolution directed to the president and directors of the Moosic Powder company requesting that that corporation put the union label on all powder manufactured by it.

Increase in Wages. The one hundred and more moulders employed at the Scranton Stone works have been granted an increase of five per cent. in their wages.

It was decided upon at a joint conference held between the Iron Moulders' National association and the Stone Manufacturers' National Defense association.
