Our Foreign Trade.

Compiled for The Tribune by Walter J. Dallard. Just one more day's record of American commercial and industrial expansion, iron works in San Francisco have secured a contract for a large dredging plant in South Africa.

During one month France built 50,000 tons in ocean steamships. England built 1,200,000 tons and Germany 141,000 tons. In the whole year we only built 248,000 tons.

Our expansion is not in territory alone. For the first eight months of 1901 (Democratic) fiscal year our exports of manufactured goods amounted to \$125,000,000, but for the same period of 1902 fiscal year the figures were \$357,000,000, nearly three times as much.

Our record of exports for the first nine months of this fiscal year shows a shortage of \$50,000,000 from last year's similar period, more than accounted for by corn drought.

Our ports on the Pacific coast in March, 1902, received and imported \$1,217,055, leaving a balance in our favor of \$2,526,000.

Three years ago it was hardly possible to find a ship or tug of American origin in the Pacific. Now these articles are handled by a number of houses, and trade in other lines is increasing largely.

The following figures are eloquent of our need of a ship subsidy bill, to give us more ocean tonnage and a fair chance to increase our foreign commerce:
