

THE MARKETS

Wall Street Review.

New York, May 20.—Prices of stocks scored quite a substantial recovery today and ended the day pretty near the top level and steady. There was a much more careful feeling with regard to the outlook for values and none of the more important issues were sold on a sudden. Among high priced but seldom active stocks were securities of International Power recovered 5 points of its 15 point break of yesterday, and there were wide gains scored by the electrical and express stocks which were notable sufferers yesterday. There was not much news on which to base the rise. Sentiment was favorably affected by the large absorption of United States Steel at rising prices. This soothed the anxieties which were caused by yesterday's rumors that a formidable bear party had been formed in the stock as an outgrowth of the criticism of the stock conversion and bond issue plan. The favorable strength of Canadian Pacific and its subsidiary roads, Minneapolis, St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie and Duluth, South shore and Atlantic, also had a notable sympathetic effect on the whole market. This movement began about before the opening here and was explained by any specific news. London was a buyer on a considerable scale after the holiday there, and confident predictions were heard that prices would be declared at an early day in South Africa. The formal announcement of the terms for the taking over jointly by Louisville and Nashville and Southern Railway of the Chicago, Indianapolis and Louisville falls in relation to the price of Louisville bonds was chiefly reflected in the price of Louisville. The terms of exchange of the stock of 78 for the common and 90 for the preferred led to some recession in their prices, as the joint bonds, judged by the precedent of the Burlington exchange bonds, are not likely to command a full par value. The presence in the Wall street district of Secretary Sayers, of the Civic Federation and his constant reference to important representatives of the extractive interests gave rise to conjectures that measures were in progress toward the settlement of the extractive miners' strike. Wall street opinion remains confident that a settlement lies within reach at almost any time. There was also much less apprehension today of a spread of the labor trouble into the bituminous rock fields, which was considered the prospect yesterday.
