St. Patrick's Parochial School Will Close Today—Three Funerals Yesterday—P. O. S. of A. Officers—Other Notes.

The sixteenth annual commencement exercises of St. Patrick's Parochial school will be held this evening in the basement of the church, commencing at 7:30 o'clock. The interior has been prettily decorated for the event, and a large attendance is anticipated.

There are sixteen in this year's graduating class, in the classical and commercial courses, all of whom have acquitted themselves very creditably in their studies. The school orchestra will assist in the exercises.

Master Arthur DeAyala will deliver the salutatory address, and the class poem will be read by Miss Regina McDermott. The programme contains a number of interesting things, among them being the "Promenade of Dudes and Peddlers," "Red Riding Hood's Rescue," violin solo, by Frank McHale; a sword drill, a number of pretty choruses and a cantata, "The Druid Priestess," in which members of the graduating class will take part.

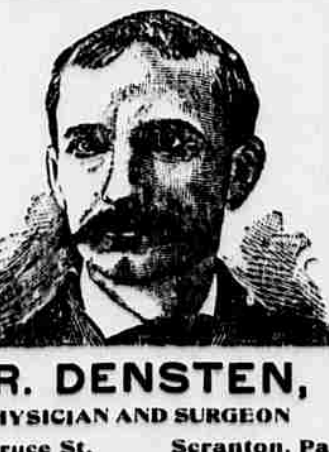
