CRIMINAL ATTEMPT BY UNKNOWN PROWLER

Man Boldly Assaults Two Women at Old Early Foundry on Seventh Avenue, but Is Repulsed—Has Stopped Other Women Passing to Their Homes—Police Have a Clue.

Unquestionably the boldest criminal attempt in Carbondale within recent years took place about 9:30 Friday night, when an unknown prowler attacked one of two women who were on the way home. He made a shockingly indecent exhibition, but was repulsed before he was successful in his shameful purpose.

The boldness of the attempted crime from the circumstances that it took place only a block off Main street in a building that is well traveled from early evening until only a few belated ones make their way home.

Seventh avenue, just below Mill street, as the crowd of the abandoned building early Saturday was the scene of the happening. The place chosen for the act is the most inviting along the street. It is intensely dark, there being no light at the Mill street corner.

On the night of the attack, two women came down Seventh avenue about 9:30. They were on their way to the West Side. They reached the alley way leading into the foundry yard when the man sprang from behind the fence, where he was crouching. His appearance was grossly indecent. He grabbed at the skirts of the woman nearest him, but in the confusion, she escaped.

The police are on the look out for the man and are sure that he is a person of some importance. The scene of his prowling was patrolled last night, but no trace of him was observed.
