New York, Aug. 12,—The dominating factors in the stock market continue to be the coming crops and the money outlook. Crop news was eminently satisfactory today, both that of the monthly report of the agricultural department and the later news of the weather bureau but it is to be born in mind that the speculation for some time past has been diligently discounting good crops, which have been clearly foreshadowed. On the other hand, the autumn activity in the money market while it has been expected and made the subject of industrious warnings has been ignored in speculation. This week's rise in money rates, therefore, would naturally be of most effect on speculative conditions. There was considerable strength at one time today and in a few cases it continued to the close, but for the most part the early rise in prices was taken advantage of to realize profits and the general level of prices ended lower than last night. There was a further contraction also in the volume of dealings which dropped back again below half a million shares. Unofficial estimates on today's government reports indicate a wheat harvest of over 652,000,000 bushels. This is nearly a hundred million bushels below the crop of last year but has never been exceeded except by that crop and the one of 1898. As for the corn crop, today's government igures indicate the yield the largest in the history of the country. This had its effect amongst the southwestern grangers, especially amongst the Gould group. Another striking show of strength was made by Baltimore and Ohio. Amongst the returns of railroad gross earnings for the first week of August Chesapeake and Ohio shows a decrease of \$163,553, compared with last year and Missouri Pacific's earnings for the same period declined \$28,000. 
