

ANOTHER MINE IN OPERATION THE LACKAWANNA COMPANY STARTS A FIFTH PLACE.

Bliss Colliery at Nanticoke Gotten Under Way with About One Hundred Men, Most of Them Former Employees—Present Output of the Lackawanna Region Estimated to Be in the Neighborhood of 15,000 Tons a Day—Watchman at Richmond No. 3 Assaulted.

Another Delaware, Lackawanna and Western colliery was gotten under way yesterday. It is the Bliss, at Nanticoke, one of the biggest of the region.

The Delaware and Hudson company has the Dickson colliery and the Plymouth, Grassy Island and Racket Brook washeries at work at present.
