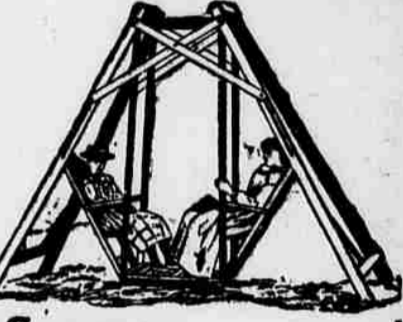

OUR INTERNAL TRADE

During the half year to the end of June, 1902, the average price of wheat... INFORMATION of timely value to the commerce of the country is brought forth in the monthly report of the internal commerce, issued by the treasury bureau of statistics. Of interior trade movements the report shows that the receipts at the five markets of Chicago, Kansas City, Omaha, St. Louis and St. Joseph reached a total amount of 1,332,928 bushels for the corresponding period of 1902. There is a difference of 1,101,878 bushels to be supplied before the receipts of the current year shall have equalled those of last year. Analysis of stocks of cut meats at the five markets of Chicago, Kansas City, Omaha, St. Joseph, and Milwaukee show on hand 29,041,067 pounds for the corresponding date of 1901 the combined stock consisted of 29,801,346 pounds. Philadelphia and Baltimore show that for the first seven months of the current year the receipts of grain and flour reduced to bushels, at New York were 56,258,080 bushels, compared with 52,358,000 bushels for the corresponding period of 1901. Traffic in iron and steel originated in southern producing territory during the first seven months of this year amounted to 1,311,375 tons, compared with 857,700 tons for the corresponding period of 1901. There has been a decline in this traffic in July, the tonnage of 142,539 tons being the smallest in the course of the current year. Reported shipments from Philadelphia were as follows: For June, 102,600 tons; for six months ending with June, 1,271,191 tons. Coastwise coal shipments from Baltimore during June were 12,806 tons, and for six months to the end of June, 1,068,797 tons. The total amount reported from the three ports was 41,960 tons in June, and 2,483,884 tons for six months ending with June. Coal receipts at Boston, mostly by coastwise lines, for the first seven months of 1901, were 2,661,246 tons. This year's receipts were 2,677,797 tons.
