

THE MARKETS.

Wall Street Review.

New York, Oct. 24.—Some relief was shown today and greater ease of call money and foreign exchange rates, but there was no demand for stocks and the market was irregular and dull throughout. For reasons that are not altogether clear the substantial financial interests continue to hold aloof and even the pool manipulators remain inactive. It is true that conditions such as prevailed during the week are not unusual at the approach of an election, but traders and shrewd observers generally say that this does not altogether account for the absolute lack of public buying. The rise in the price of coal and further rumors of labor troubles in various parts of the country were among the few developments of the day. The strong features at the opening were Lackawanna, Reading common and second preferred, Baltimore and Ohio, and Toledo, St. Louis and Western issues. Operations in the last named stocks were again believed to be largely manipulative and Baltimore and Ohio soon lost its initial gain. Firmness was shown in such issues as Atchafalaya, Union Pacific, St. Paul, Missouri Pacific and Colorado Fuel and Iron. The latter was stronger on reports of buying by interests opposed to those now in control. An early sale of St. Joseph and Island sec. and preferred was made at a decline of over 2 per cent, and later a further loss was recorded. The reaction in Baltimore and Ohio rights for cash was presumably due to the fact that the option on the rights expires today. Trading was very light all through the morning session and fluctuations were narrow. Speculation was limited almost entirely to the specialties, the early movements in Colorado Fuel and Iron, Baltimore and Ohio, and Western issues being continued. Colorado Fuel was the real feature, transactions in that stock aggregating more than one-fifth of the total business with a net advance of 10 per cent. Favorable reports concerning the coal stocks and the steel and iron issues were heard, but they failed to induce any demand. The afternoon session brought no developments and such trading as was reported came from out of town. In addition to Colorado Fuel, Reading second, Virginia, Carolina Chemical, Cotton Oil, Tennessee Coal, Amalgamated Copper, and United Fruit were sold today, 204,700 shares. Railroad bonds were sluggish but steadier all around. Total sales, 2,000,000 shares. The States bonds were all unchanged on the last call.

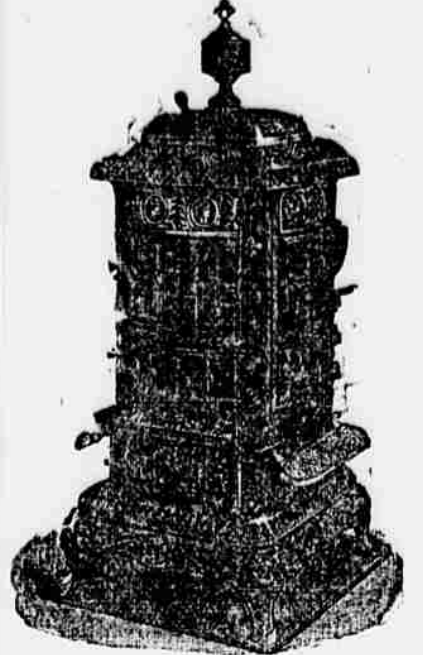

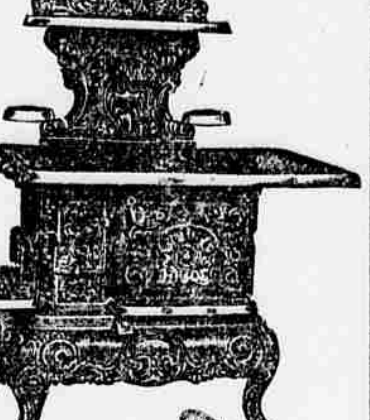
