New York, Dcc. II.—The stock market had a demoralized appearance at times today when an eager unloading of securities was in progress without regard to prices. The volume of dealings rose to over a million shares or about double those of yesterday, which were again more than double those of the day before. The throwing upon the market of this greatly augmented volume of liquidation met with vory poor absorption power, and violent declines were the result. There were points in the market, where more resistance was shown than in others, notably amongst the Pennsylvania group, Reading, Amadgamated Copper and Sugar. The last named stock closed Chicago, Dec. II.—Prices in the grain the day with an actual net gain of a small fraction. 


