The British Government proposes to make all

the acts of the Roman Catholic Bishop in their

offices, and to make them responsible for any  
acts, forfeited to them, for religious purposes,

forfeited to the Crown.

The bill also prevents any assumption of any  
titles or dignities of the Anglican church, or any  
place or district in the United Kingdom.

No mention of the Colonies was made in  
the Queen's speech, and the omission causes some

surprise and disappointment.

The President of France, has followed up his
