MISCELLANEOUS.

The emigration to America—Great numbers of German emigrants are leaving from the French and Belgian ports. From Liverpool, and other German ports, also, the emigrants are numerous. On the 1st to the 15th March not fewer than 3,200 immigrants came from the month of March. In all, between 700 and 800 were waiting for vessels to convey them.

In Upper Austria the tide of emigration has increased, and this is by no means confined to the Germans. The people, however, large farmers and persons possessed of considerable landed property leave the country in great numbers, and for fortune in America. Dr. Anthony Warren, of Newark, formerly Deputy to the Austrian Minister of Finance, and a man of great respectability, who will travel for his fortune, has a transmarine home in the course of a few weeks.

In Bohemia, in a district of Bielovitza, an emigration society has been formed, the object of which is to assist a Bohemian and Moravian colony to America.

We have been informed that there will be a large transmigration of continental emigrants, who will leave Europe in the spring, caused by the low rates of fare charged by steamship companies.

From Bremen, for example, to New York, by first class, the passage charge is about \$26 per head, while from Liverpool it is only from \$6 to \$8, and the expenses from Liverpool are less than \$10.
