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 The Moderator then called for the report of the Committee on the Synodical Fund. The report was read and approved.  
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On motion, it was resolved that a committee be appointed for the purpose of examining and reporting on the proposed constitution of the Synod.

 Height of dome to top of spire, 110 feet.  
 Height of spire, 120 feet.  
 Two towers are to be placed in front on the main building, each 200 feet in height; and the center of the tower will be surrounded by a dome. There will be four side chapels, each having an altar. The cost of the building is expected to reach \$500,000.
