

HOME MATTERS.

MARSHAL MUSICALS.—The delightful and eloquent Marquis, who has been giving a grand series of musical evenings at the Auditorium, has now closed his house at the Masonic Hall. They play, sing and dance admirably. Our readers about go and see them.

BURGLARIA.—Four dwelling houses, situated near the corner of Elm and Franklin streets, were broken into by burglars during yesterday evening. The robbers made off with valuable articles worth about five dollars.

COURT JAIL.—During the week ending yesterday evening, forty-two persons were committed to prison charged of vagrancy, drunkards, street disorders, and other offenses. All these cases were also committed for trial in the Court of Quarter Sessions.

A MURKIN.—A young man named Peter DeMoss, a member of a Prospect street, was arrested on a charge of assault and battery. He was charged, on oath of his aged parents, with threatening to kill their son.

LANCER.—A colored woman, named Sarah Fredericks, was committed to prison by Alfred E. Smith, on a charge of assault and battery. The facts of Fredericks' assault with striking clothing to the value of ten dollars from him. A search was made, and the clothing found in her house.

ASIAN AND BARBERS.—A woman named Dickens, a resident of Prospect street, also lodged a complaint against the above defendant, charging her with assault and battery. This made the third charge which is preferred against her.

LAWMAN'S STATION.—A new station is to be erected on the Pennsylvania railroad, between Erie's and Clinton's station, to be termed Lawman's station.

DISTINGUISHED ARRIVALS.—Mr. Thompson, President of the Pennsylvania railroad company, and Mr. George F. Edmunds, a member of Congress, are now stopping in this city for a short time.

DISCHARGED.—In the course of the week ending yesterday, forty-five persons were discharged from the State prison. The number does not exceed this number by twice. There are now only five persons imprisoned under various charges.

FRUITFUL HARVEST.—A man named George Mowry, committed for further heating by the Mayor, after a charge of vagrancy, preferred against him a charge of assault and battery.
