During the summer of 1881, soon after the difficulties with the Winnebago Indians had been amicably adjusted by a visit of one of their Washington, accompanied by Gov. Cass, a Sioux Indian, while out hunting by the mouth of the Root River, shot and scalped a Winnebago, which he attempted to justify by saying that the Winnebago had wrapped around his person the blanket of an Indian, who, a short time previous, had murdered his brother. The Winnebago was indicted for the murder.

The officers of the fort, apprehensive that difficulties might arise with this Indian tribe, if their demands were unattended to, concluded to make an effort to obtain the murderer. Accordingly an officer was dispatched to demand him of the Winnebago, who immediately gave him up, and he was brought down the river and confined at Fort Crawford. Soon after his arrival at the fort, the Winnebago was assembled at Fort Crawford, and demanded of Col. Taylor the punishment of a murderer of the garrison, to have a talk with them upon the subject. At the conference, the Winnebago talked in a threatening and provoking manner, and indicated that nothing would satisfy them but taking the life of the Sioux in their own way and by themselves.

Col. Taylor, in reply, assured the Winnebago that he should have a fair trial, and that if he was found guilty, he would receive the punishment of the law. The Winnebago, however, refused to be satisfied with this, and insisted that he should be put to death at once.
