

HOME MATTERS.

LETTER OF THE HON. NEAL DOW.—The Hon. Neal Dow, of Portland, Maine, fifth street, filed last evening with the office of ladies and gentlemen, assembled to listen to the lecture of the Hon. Neal Dow, Judge McDonald, President of the "Maine Law League of Allegany County," introduced his gentle audience to the audience in a few appropriate remarks.

We publish below a mere synopsis of the delivered lecture. His style was clear and impressive, and indicated an enlightened mind.

He commenced by saying that it seemed ungrateful that the citizens of Pittsburgh had sent so far for a lecturer upon the Maine Law question. It seemed to imply that Pittsburgh and Western Pennsylvania were indifferent to the effects of any important legislation against the great parties—there was no great object in view. A few years ago there were some questions of importance, matters of dollars and cents, which in their whole extent did not exceed sixty to a hundred million of dollars. The annual expense of the trade in liquor, exceeded three hundred millions of dollars, yet nothing had been said relative to the great question.

The speaker intimated several other matters, however, compared to the spiritual welfare of the people, to their advancement in Christianity and civilization. As the speaker walked through the streets of Pittsburgh, he saw barrels upon barrels, lying on the pavements, marked Monongahela Whiskey, &c. It seemed strange to him. In Maine nothing of the sort was visible.

In Portland, Maine, before the passage of the law, hardly a house had been condemned for twenty-five years, but had its sorrow to relate. The Hon. gentleman then proceeded to recount a number of cases of poverty and misery resulting from the use of liquor. He also gave a惊人的 account of the manner of voting. If temperance would only do more for the poor, the speaker intimated, it would carry their object in spite of every opposition.

Pettit's have been sent to the Massachusetts Legislature, asking for the repeal of the prohibitory law in that State, on the ground that it was an infringement of the natural right of man. Which has no natural rights.—The public safety is the chief law, to which all private rights must yield.

The talk up in Portland was large enough for the accommodation of eighteen prisoners, and previous to the passage of the law, was filled lightly. Since the passage of that statute the lockups have been filled with barrels of liquor which had been taken in violators of the law.

The speaker intimated, while rather interesting, as it was often interspersed with a joke in its delivery. It is expected that Mr. Dow will give another lecture prior to his departure from the city.
