

HOME MATTERS.

Brews, Inns.—The river was very slowly swelling on Saturday, the stage of water in the evening being 7 feet full. A further rise was generally looked for.

The Thomas Swan went out gallantly and beautifully Saturday, loaded to the gunwales with freight. The Alvin Adams was to follow yesterday, and the Keystone State leaves to-day. The Pittsburgh came up on Saturday, and will arrive to-morrow.

The only arrival Saturday, besides the packats, was the Adelie, which had been laid in a very heavy load, as will be seen by referring to the list of imports.

The wharf was fairly well cleared out, on Saturday, the departs being large. The Force Rest, the Equinox, the Clara Dean, and the Huron, as well as the packats, went out with their loads of freight. The Equinox, especially, is in a very available position on board excepted with freight.

The Adelie left this morning for Zanesville. If there is any room left, those who want to travel on board of her had better be in a hurry.

The Durnal is the regular packet for Wheeling.

The Exchange is the afternoon packet for the day.

Published on Saturday the 19th an item from the St. Louis News stating the coffee from Baltimore is now being shipped through this place for St. Louis and other points in the West. It may be seen on our wharf almost any day. It is shipped over the Baltimore & Susquehanna Railroad to Harrisburg and from thence over the Pennsylvania Road to Pittsburgh. Shippers are learning to prefer this route, because if they should happen to be unable to follow the Ohio River it can be sent on as conveniently by the Ohio & Pennsylvania Railroad as an advantage possessed by Pittsburgh alone.

Urgent Starts Circuit Court.—Judges Grier on the Bench.

Dagger vs Shriver. The plaintiff, a citizen of Ohio, was prosecuted in the Criminal Courts of Franklin County for the sale of a pistol to a negro slave, but he was acquitted. The suit was not being made out. This suit is to recover damages for malicious prosecution.

Bribery Cases.—Before the Hon. P. C. Chapman, President Judge.

In the case last reported Saturday morning, the jury returned a verdict of \$25,000 for plaintiff. The trial adjourned to Monday.
