

HOME MATTERS.

RYAN TRIUMPH.—The river is receding slowly; the stage of water last night was 81 feet. The weather had moderated considerably, and the indications were favorable to success.

THE ALLEGANY was running low, but this did not deter the boats from running. The Exchange and Diamond went out on their regular trips. The Washington City took out a fast load to New Orleans. She had 3200 molasses barrels on board (not barrels of molasses, as stated in the evening papers), and any quantity of plows, carts, wagons, &c.

THE details of disaster to coal boats are distressing. The storm of Sunday night was a fearful one, and has entailed a tremendous loss upon our coal men. As far as is heard from, 79 boats have been lost, out of 270 that left for the late river nearly a month; and this is to be added the loss of 17 men, 12 of them Pittsburghers. At best, the coal business is a hazardous one, and those who adventure their capital in it do it at fearful risks; but at no time in the history of coal hauling has such disaster befallen us as we have now to record.
