The Irish and American Hiet in New Orleans.
We regret to state that our city has again been the scene of a disgraceful riot, which we fear has or will result fatally. It is difficult to get at the origin of the affair, but as near as we can learn it arose out of the arrest and alleged brutal treatment of Mr. Henry T. Sherman by some watchner, on Thursday night. On Saturday night, at a late hour, some of Mr. Sherman's friends, hearing that an attack upon his house was peditate, proceeded up Tchoupitilas street, and while there attacked or were attacked by some watchmen and their friends.
