

## HOME MATTERS.

Courts of Quakers Suspend.—Before Judges McHugh, Boggs and Adams.

Two men, James Cathcart and his son, committed assault and battery with intent to kill, on path of Peter Cliff. The parties reside near Ferry Street and 21st or 22d Streets. The son had a difficulty about the manner in which Cathcart treated his father, and Cliff refusing to come down stairs and fight, and Cathcart threatening to shoot him. He loaded a pistol and discharged it at a window in the second story, through which Cliff had been talking to him a moment before. Cathcart was taken to a medical man, who sentenced him to pay a fine of \$50 and costs.

Court: No. 30, N. Y. Criminal charge of assault and battery, on path of Peter Cliff. The parties were both released, and the prosecutor alleged that the defendant had threatened to knock her head off with his fist. The court adjourned hearing testimony on both sides of the case, ordered the costs to be divided equally between the parties.

Court: The Henry Pratt; indictment assault and battery, on path of John Logan. The parties are now prisoners, and the prosecutor swore he had no evidence to sustain the charge. C. O. Cox, calling will be sustained by Pratt, who knocked him down and beat him severely, broke his jaw and otherwise injured him. The defense will file a motion for a new trial, on the ground that the evidence of the pugilists' strike, and may be traced to the fact that Logan, as it was alleged, went to work for the defense, and that he was beaten.

The defendant was sentenced to pay a fine of \$10 and undergo three months imprisonment in the city jail.

Court: No. 30, N. Y. Court: Indictment assault and battery, on path of Peter Cliff. The defendant in this case is the wife of James Cathcart, who has been suspended from the Society of Friends.
