THE BANK QUESTION .- The Harrisburg Herald has at last been driven to complain of "the reckless facility with which the Legislature of Penn-sylvania—and especially the House of Representatives-thrusts through the applications for new banking institutions."

We copy some of its statements:

"There are about eighty applications pending; and we are credibly informed that the committee on Banks in the lower House; so far as the bills have been reached, have reported favorably in every instance, and that without a single exception that body has passed every bank bill that has come before it. Already it has sanctioned an increase of four or five millions to our banking capital,—and unless the people and the press speak out upon the subject we may expect the entire twenty millions demanded by reckless speculators to be granted. Nine bank bills, with a capital of \$2,200,000 have already been presented to the Governor, seven of which, with a copital of \$1,550,000, are proposed to be located in the interior,—and in addition to this a large number of bills have passed the House and are now awaiting the action of the Senate."
