The Copper and Brass Rolling Mill.

Pittsburgh enterprise made the first practical effort to develop the resources of the Lake Superior Copper Mine.

It required much faith, and almost a prophetic foreknowledge to invest hundreds of thousands of dollars in a mere experiment, based upon a few isolated masses of ore and here and there a poor sulphuric or oxide vein. But an invincible energy, and by constantly increasing experience, a steady development, and a fortunate chance opened to the miners the celebrated Cliff Mine. Since then, the Copper has steadily progressed, and now those who were the pioneers in its development are beginning to reap the rewards of their early toil and toil.

Twelve years ago, the pits by the lake shore at Copper Harbor were turning out their almost bare ore, with now and then a mass of a few hundred pounds of metal to wonder at. Now the mines open the world to wonders at. The world's wealth is at their disposal, and they produce thousands of tons of ore every day. And very appropriately Pittsburgh has become an important and prominent mart for the copper in its manufactured state, and here, too, it is manufactured on an extensive scale. This introduces to our notice the Pittsburgh Rolling Mill on Bradock Street, fronting on the lake shore, about one and a half miles east of the Copper House. We had the pleasure of a visit to this works Saturday, and examined them throughout. They were owned by C. G. Hussey & Co., of No. 101 Wood Street.

Copper is received from the mines in three distinct conditions: first, in "masses," weighing from two to four hundred pounds, in small fragments weighing from 100 to 150 pounds each, which are transported in barrels, and are usually termed "barrel ore"; and third, in a granulated powder, like coarse sand, which is put up at the mine in barrels, and which is termed "stamp work," from the fact that it is the result of stamping the ore, and from thence the name. The stamp work is valued at \$3,000 per ton, and was taken in the office of the Western Farmer's Insurance Company. The progress of the work is shown in the following extract from the report of the fireman: "The copper in the stamp work is melted and run into ingots of two to four pounds, and other articles discarded by yesterday's quotations."
