LAWRENCE, Kannas, April 30, 1856.—In my last I mentioned that the Kickapon Bangers were encamped on the opposite side of the river.

Two of the citizens of Lawrence want over that evening to reconnoitre the position, &c., of the enemy. They were seen and fired upon, and chased by some rangers on horse back, but by dodging in among trees, escaped. We have shoot learned that the enemy intended to murder them if oaught. They are very bitter towards the people of this city, because Jones was shot here. Yesterday it rained very hard, and the Hangers dispersed. Where they now are is not known.

A gentleman visited Franklin last evening and reports that Jones is not expected to recover the wound is a bad one and very much inflamed. Sam. Laitus, in whose lakes a lady of Lawrence throw some hot water, when he came to search for and arrest her husband, is very badly off, one side of his face to scalded bad, taking off his beard and skin. It will be a long time before he will be out sagin. The report that he had resigned his office is confirmed. The Congress commissioners are busily engaged taking testimony.
