FRUGALITY AMONO THE NEGROES.—In the foundery of Gaty, McCune & Co., at St. Louis, among its two hundred and seventy operatives are two negroes, who began life at the establishment in 1849 as slaves. By dint of unflagging industry in due course of time one of them bought himself, wife and five children, paying for himself \$1400, and on an average for wife and children \$800 each. This negro is now supposed to be worth in his own right more than \$6,000 in real estate in that city. Another negro entering the factory about the same time, amassed sufficient money by his attention to duty to purchase himself at the price of \$1,600, his wife at \$600, and four children at \$400 each, and is now worth \$50,000 in real estate. These negroes were bought from their masters by Mr. Gray, with the understanding that they should work themselves free, and out of his own pockets he gave two per cent interest on the deferred payments. The children of both are now receiving an excellent education at the public schools of St. Louis.
