RAGS.—A gentleman in the trade supposes that about 25,000 bales of rags, averaging 275 lbs each, are every year received at New York from Europe. A very large portion come from Glasgow, Scotland and Leghorn, Itally. Last year about 3,000 bales were received by one house from the land of Pharoah, being shipped from the port of Alexandria for New York.

These were the first rags brought from Egypt to the United States, as previously they had gone to London and Liverpool.
