**THE ARRIVAL OF THE 'CHARLOTTE' (Va.)** Republican tells the following as happening in the vicinity of Mount Pleasant, in this State, not long since.

Not far from Mount Pleasant back in the country here, there is a tavern called the 'Franklin House.' It is, however, a well known fact that the railroad company is not liable for such accidents, unless it can be shown that it was negligent in some respect.

The case of the 'Spoon' or 'Railway' is a well known one. It occurred on the Pennsylvania Railroad, and resulted in the loss of human life and property. The railroad company was held liable for the accident, and was ordered to pay damages to the plaintiff.
