BATTLE OF MONTENELLO.—Once more the field of Montebello has brought victory to a Bonaparte; and another Lannes has lived to see the arms of France once more triumphant on the scene which gave to his family the title by which they are to this day distinguished. Nearly two generations have passed away since, on the 9th of June, 1800, nine thousand French soldiers, advancing from the Stradella, met at the villages of Casteggio and Montebello, the outposts of an Austrian army eighteen thousand strong, under the orders of Ott and O'Reilly. To the advantage of numbers the Austrian forces, joined that of position, occupying as they did the hamlets of Casteggio and Montebello, on a broken ground, and made defensible by the solid character of the Piedmontese village architecture. In the rear of the Austrian forces, too, was the army of Melas, holding Alessandria; and the men who were commissioned to crush the conscripts of Lannes, were the same, as Thiers observes, who had besieged Marsena in Genoa, had been formed by him to encounter the rudest shooks, and had just forced him to surrender. They were assisted too by a numerous artillery, and displayed in the action, which lasted nine weary hook had besieged the "noise made by the shattering of the bones of his men to the orsshing of glass in a hall-storm." But neither the weight of numbers, nor the sirength of a formidable position, nor the impulse of a recent victory, nor the superiority of their artillery, nor ther undanuted bravery, enabled the Austrian forces in 1800 to make their way through the indomitable solding of Cannes, and General Bonaparte, coming Druggists.
