About this time he was connected with a mammoth scheme, in which be issued numerous certificates at \$10,50 a piece, entitling persons to a life membership in the Mount Vernon Association, and an engraving of the home and grave of Washington, the proceeds to be diverted to the repairs of the yard and house of the Father of his country. He represented himself as an agent of the Association.
