Mr. Hull, about a year since, was attacked by a very peculiar mental malady, which has all along defed the best medical treatment. It occasionally manifested itself in singular hal-ludiations, fits of gloomy despondency, depres-sion of spirits, and an unaccountable shyness, which made him shan observation and avoid the which made him shun observation and avoid the prosence of almost every person. These fits had alarmingly increased in length and frequency sines the death of his faiher. For a few days previous, however, to this sad and distressing concurrences, he appeared more rational, and much more cheerful to his friends than formerly. On Thursday morning, when all were absent except his mother, from the house, he left her in the parlor and, as she thought, retired to his room. At dinner time, not making his appearance when the bell was rung the second time, she went in seatch of him. Not finding him in his room, she opened the door of another, and was horrified at finding him lying on the floor, dead, with his head usarly severed from his body, It would appear that one of the gloomy periods coming on, he had, in a fit of desperate mental agony, out his throat with a razor, which Mr. Hull was a young man of unusual worth and amiability, and was respected by all who know him, and his death will cast a gloom over the whole community.
