Insanity is the irregular morbid action or perversion of the menual powers of any individual leading him to act or expression of thought and feeling the reverse of what was his usual habit in a state of health and sound mind; and every case of insanity must be judged only by a comparison of the individual in his state of mental disorder with himself when in a state of sound mental action, so far as that

mental disorder with himself when in a state of sound mental action, so far as that condition can be ascertained from those who have known him longest and best and are most familiar with his peculiarities.

No rigid standard can be set up to which all cases must be made to conform.
