EUROPEAN WAR.

Malest as we are, we cannot help feeling gratified to see our friends verified in their gloomy rumors. The reader will recollect that we sent a Pro-Southern invader to Boston, and the steamer Persialis brought us the news of R. It was certainly a bold stroke, but it can only as yet excite by the Prussian. Presidents most either had reliable information that the reported strength of the Aspern had been exaggerated or must be very strong themselves. Good judgments are the leading army of the Crown Prince to consist of only three army corps, or about 117,000 men, but we cannot share the same opinion. The news brought by the Persialis is conflicting, both parties claiming the victory. We credit the news that the Prussians were victorious in three engagements fought on the 21st, 22d, and 23d at Xerxes-Taurian (out Trajans), and we also credit the geographic reporters it had) and Muenchgaard. By the Austrian despatch it is a different story. They admit that they were poor at first, but that afterwards they drove the Persialis in turn, taking from them prisoners, arms, and horses. Still, however, they will remain in the field which the two armies had to fight on each other's ground, and the French will be more certain of their victory.
