AN ORDINANCE increasing the

penalty for the violation of the

provisions of the Act in relation to

the sale of liquor, passed by the

Commons of the State of Pennsylvania,

at the session of the same, held at

Harrisburg, on the 21st day of

August, 1866.

Section 1. That the penalty for the

violation of the provisions of the

Act in relation to the sale of

liquor, shall be a fine of not

less than five dollars, nor more

than ten dollars, for each

violation, and imprisonment for

not more than thirty days, or

both such fine and imprisonment,
