TELEGRAPHIC SUMMARY.

Washington, Sept. 18.—The President has received from the Secretary of the Interior a report on the progress of the survey of the public lands in the State of California. The report shows that the survey is well advanced, and that the lands are being disposed of in accordance with the law. The President has approved the report, and has directed the Secretary to continue the survey.

FROM EUROPE.

London, Sept. 18.—The House of Commons has passed a bill to amend the law relating to the duties on foreign goods. The bill provides that the duties on foreign goods shall be increased in certain cases, and that the duties on certain classes of goods shall be reduced. The bill is expected to become law in the near future.

MEXICO AND WEST INDIES.

Mexico, Sept. 18.—The Government has received news from the State of Yucatan that the rebels have been defeated in a battle near the city of Merida. The rebels were killed in large numbers, and the Government forces have taken possession of the city. The news is a great relief to the Government, and is expected to lead to a speedy end to the rebellion.
