FINANCE AND TRADE. The apparent rising tendency of gold, engineered by a powerful oligue of brokers in Wall Street, has brought out a number of reports as buyers for 30-day's steamers, and the price jumped late last evening from 140 1/4 to 140 3/4, followed by a morning decline to 140 1/4. This was caused partly by the report that the Government would anticipate the coupons due July next, which, however, was not confirmed, and the consequent withdrawal of orders to purchase for a rise. When the cables showing the daily excessive imports of produce abroad are closely examined there, it seems would be sufficient reason for a further advance in gold, but since these goods are not purchased abroad, but merely consigned for sale, it does not follow that immediate payment is to be made. Nor is it known what amount of securities are actually held abroad; it is just as doubtful whether remittances have been made to Europe in specie for the interest and dividends becoming due on July next, or whether these funds will not be used in Government, Union or Central Pacific Railroad bonds, or Railroad and Mining property, of which large tracts change hands now. Not unless these data can be more definitely ascertained, no correct estimate can be made what amount of paper currency would be equal to a gold dollar, and the fact should be remembered that the two contending elements for a rise and fall of gold at New York are the importers and the brokers and speculators. It seems as if the brokers on an easy money market would have the advantage over the importers who have goods that can not be pledged for money so readily as bonds or stock.
