

PITTSBURGH MARKETS.

The general markets are somewhat more active, and there seems to be a general impression that an improvement in business is near at hand. The only drawback now is the uncertainty in regard to values, and particularly is this the case in Flour and Grain. Opinions are conflicting in this respect; some think that prices are entirely too much inflated, and, as a consequence, are not disposed to do much as yet; while others are inclined to believe that the crop have not or will not turn out as well as expected, and these instead of a decline, anticipated an advance. Wheat in nearly all of the leading markets, both East and West, has been - and is still dull and weak with a drooping tendency, and, as a matter of course, Flour follows the track of Wheat.

the market is less active, though prices are unchanged at 30c to 32c, for good to prime EGGS—Continue very dull, with a supple- mentary increase in excess of the demand; now quote at 16c to 18c.

CHEESE—Is steady but unchanged at 4c to 16c for Western Reserve and Hamden; 1c to 17c for Factory; and 20c for Switzer.

HAY—Sales in Allegheny Diamond market of 77 loads at \$20 to \$28, as to quality.

GRAIN—Continues to be quiet.

GREEN APPLES—Are coming in pretty freely, though the demand as yet seems to keep up with the supply and prices are unchanged at \$5.50 to \$5 per bush, as to quality.

PEACHES—Are being sold at \$4 to \$5 per box.

POPPLES—Quiet and unchanged at \$3 to \$3.75 per bush.
