THE CATTLE PLAGUE.

FROM EUROPE.

Hay Exportation from the United States—Banquet for Farragut to the Turkish Ministry—Inauguration in Bulgaria, Ac.

GREAT BRITAIN.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—Among the cargo of the steamship Nebraska, which arrived at Liverpool a few days since, was a large quantity of hay, shipped from New York to be sold in this market. The hay was accordingly put up at auction yesterday, and the bidding was sold at from one hundred and thirty shillings per ton. English hay of no better quality than the American was not quite so much as the quantity of hay, shipped from New York to be sold in this market.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—A dispatch from Rome states that Rev. Dr. Henry E. Manning, the prominent Catholic divine, and secretary of the Vatican, has been appointed Bishop of London to be made a Cardinal. It is also reported that Monsignor Joseph Bernardi will soon receive Cardinal Antonelli's resignation and President of the Papal Ministry.

TURKEY.

CONSTANTINOPLE, August 27.—Admiral Farragut gave a grand banquet yesterday on board the flag ship Franklin to members of the Turkish Ministry and Ambassadors of Foreign powers at Constantinople.

FRANKFURT, August 27.—Admiral Ruzhik reported that insurgent bands had again made their appearance in Bulgaria and several conflict had taken place between them and the Turkish troops. The result is yet unknown.

PORTUGAL.

LISBON, August 27.—The Chamber of Peers met to-day. A bill for raising a loan of 10,000,000 francs was passed. The Chamber has also voted a supply of 50,000 francs for the fortifications of Lisbon.

FRANCE.

PARIS, August 27.—It is announced that the Emperor will visit the camp at Chalons on the 2d of September.

The sale of the *Figaro* newspaper in the streets of Paris has been prohibited.

DENMARK.

COPENHAGEN, August 27.—The Danish Government has adopted the adoption of the decimal system of coinage in the national mints.
