the only important characteristic noticeable
in the general market to-day. Nor is

APPLES-In consequence of diminished
receipts, the market is considerably firmer
and are now quoted at \$3 to \$4 per bushel.

POTATOES-Sales at \$1.20 per bushel,
and \$3.50 per bushel. Jersey sweets scarce
and higher, \$6.50 to \$7 per bushel.

BUTTER-Prime to choice fresh packed
is scarce and prices are still maintained,
ranging from 57 to 60.

EGGS-Scarce and in better demand; we
now quote fresh packed at 20 to 21c.

GRAIN-Wheat is quiet and unchanged,
the market is considerably firmer and are
now quoted at \$3 to \$4 per bushel.

PROVISIONS-Bacon is steady but un-
changed at 14 1/2 to 15c for Shoulders;
Cured Hams, Lard is firm at 24c.

MILL FEED-The demand is fair, and
prices unchanged; the mills continue to
quote at \$1.10 for Bran; \$1.30 for Shipstuffs,

FLOUR-The demand is fair, notwithstanding
the market is weak, with a
slight tendency to a noticeable fact,

Government bonds keep firm especially
the new issues which are bought up now
or exchanged for old Five-Twenties of 1882

Under the present easy money market;
any change towards stringency, may bring
down stock like a card house.

The market was moderately active, the
sales aggregating 5,600 bbls but prices, as
will be seen, are a shade lower.
