GRAIN - Wheat is quiet and unchanged at \$1.15 to \$1.16. Corn is steady but unchanged; sales in lots of some 600 bushels on wharf, at \$1.15 to \$1.18. Barley is firm, with sales of prime Spring at \$2.00 and unchanged at \$1.10 for Bran; \$1.15 for Shorts; \$1.50 for Shipstuffs, and \$2 for Middlings.

NEW YORK DRY GOODS MARKET. (By Telegram to the Pittsburgh Gazette.) New York, Oct. 3. - Dry goods market quiet but steady. The probability is that heavy sheetings will advance before long, as goods are new and some outside lots of 16 1/2 to 17 1/2 for best Eastern, such as Pacific extra, Stark A, Appleton A and Atlantic A. Fine Iron Sheetings and Shirtings also advanced, but the stock is becoming much reduced. Great Falls and Booth are selling at 12 1/2, which is the lowest. Atlantic Shirtings are also selling at the low price of 12 1/2 to 13 1/2. The Saturday Bleached Muslin are selling down to 12 by the case, and the Brail job at 14 by the package, and 15 1/2 by the case. Prints steady at 7 1/2 for 64 gauge, Mouse Daines of regular makes steady at 20. Spragues 10, but some outside lots of Lowell and other makes have been bought from second hands and selling by the case at 18. The styles, however, are not fresh. The Manchester Cotton style which has introduced some new printed styles, which are selling at 22.

CHICAGO CATTLE MARKET. (By Telegram to the Pittsburgh Gazette.) Chicago, October 3. - Cattle market dull, with light demand by packers and city butchers; sales at 34c for Texas steers and fair cows; 6c for good smooth shipping steers. Hogs dull, and the demand is confined exclusively to fat stock; sales at \$5.87, 50 for fat stock; \$5.80, 50 for good to choice hogs.
