In offering this their twentieth annual report, the Officers and Managers of the association desire to express their gratitude to God, the Dispenser of all good, who has thus far crowned their efforts with success...

The record of the Society from year to year will compare favorably with any of our charities, according to the means at their command. In view, however, of the vast extension of our city, with its increasing population, and the poverty, efforts and substantial means, commensurate with the extended fields of labor, must be put forth.

The formation of the Society was an experiment, but not a doubtful one. With woman's energy, woman's prayers and woman's faith, as well as the bright stars to cheer the hopes of worthy recipients of its alms-deeds and expanding in its upward and onward progress, each succeeding year will witness increased activity on the part of the Managers, and corresponding good be accomplished.

Twenty years ago the world seemed to be comparatively "standing still," and enterprise, commercial, moral, and religious were rather like moving on stilts under the locomotive engine or the lightning's flash.

We are in the midst of mighty revolutions, civil, political and religious. Nations are being remodeled, or "born in a day." Earthquakes are troubling the mighty deep. The moral and physical elements seem to be in a state of commotion.

It will be seen by the Treasurer's report that the Society is not in debt; and in prosecuting the work the managers will observe strictly their usual policy of confining their expenditures to the limit of their receipts.

Names of other members of the Association, who have, by the providence of God, been called from their labors, might be mentioned in this connection, but they have been entered in former annual reports.

Much might be said of the self denial of the ladies engaged in the work, and the painful and weary labors of the men of want, distress and we presented to them in their visits to the abodes of the suffering, outside and beyond the sympathies of the refined and fashionable portion of the community.

It is, however, scarcely necessary to dwell upon such points, but close by cheerful smiles to all who have heretofore so liberally contributed of their means, and trust that those who have not been called upon will feel it their duty and pleasure to make their offerings the present year, which it is apprehended will be one of more than ordinary pressure upon our charities.

Many benevolent contributions have been made by the Managers, there has been distributed during the season of coal 9,000 bushels; flour, 5,000 pounds; tea, 17 pounds; sugar, 80 pounds; shoes, 210 pairs; coffee, 31 pounds; and 2,780 yards of cotton and woolen goods.
