The general markets continue dull particularly so today, the weather being unfavorable for outdoor operations, though business is and has been for some time past, dull. It begins to look now as if after the first of the new year, and even then, our operations will be easily satisfied. Money being very tight has a tendency to squelch anything like speculative feeling, and the demand for almost everything is restricted entirely to supplying the immediate wants of the home trade.
