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the country. They are now running 75 looms and have made 3,000,000 yards of ribbon this year.

The Union Iron Mills in this city cost \$1,500,000 and cover one acre and a half of ground. 415 hands are employed. The new bridge to span the Ohio river at Cincinnati is being constructed there.

Cleveland is a busy town and does a brisk trade. In the month of November she imported from Canada 194,851 bushels of barley, received 29,920 tons of iron ore, and shipped 26,708 tons of coal.

Stettin, one of the most important ports on the Baltic Sea, imports large quantities of petroleum from this country. One hundred and thirty-five vessels, laden with that article, have arrived there this year.

A new sash and door factory has been built at Rochester, New York. It is 124 feet long, 46 feet wide and two stories high. One hundred hands are employed and 910,000 feet of seasoned lumber can be turned out yearly.

Chicago has twenty-two miles of paved streets, which have cost a million dollars a mile. Seven hundred thousand dollars have been spent this year in paving. In the city there are 107 miles of sewers, 200 miles of water pipe, and 663 miles of sidewalks.

It has been estimated that only about one-fifth of the cotton crop of 1868 has yet been sold by the producers. This one-fifth has produced about fifty millions of dollars, and Southern writers upon the cotton interest argue that the balance of four-fifths may be made to yield two hundred millions.

A large force of lumbermen has gone to the upper regions of the Grand River, Canada, to cut oak and elm for the Quebec market. Owing to the rapid variations of the river depth, this enterprise is viewed as expensive and troublesome, but the promoters hope for a good draft of water next spring.

A convention of representatives of the agricultural, manufacturing, commercial and mining interests of Georgia, met at Macon, in that State last week, to take counsel as to the best means of advancing the material interests of the Commonwealth, and to devise plans for promoting immigration from the North and Europe.
