The market this far this week has been exceedingly languid, and dull, and what is worse still, there is but little prospect of any improvement. The supply is fair, and in quality rather better than usual, but there was a remarkable scarcity of buyers, and judging from indications to-day, the largest proportion will have to be shipped east on owners account. There were one or two very nice droves in the pens, but they were sold above the New York. We sold in Philadelphia and New York. We are cognizant of 8 1/2c having been offered and refused for one of these droves, which in the present condition of the market, was regarded as a good offer. It is even at that, the owner, it is said, would not have got his money back. Prime fat steers, such as are usually bought for Philadelphia, may be quoted at 8c, and medium do at 7 1/2c. There is but very little inquiry for common stock, at any price.
