It is not a little remarkable that while Flour and Wheat are lower than they have been for several years, having declined fully fifty per cent., compared with the prices prevailing two years ago, Sugars and Provisions are almost as high in value as at any time during the war. It is admitted on all sides that the supply of the two last named articles is comparatively light while the supply of former is unusually heavy, but the question as to whether the difference in the supplies is sufficient to justify the present difference in values, is an important one, and one in which all are more or less interested.

APRIL BUTTER—Firm, 80¢. Apples—In fair demand and limited supply. May be quoted at 14¢. Corn—There is considerable inquiry for prime to choice Holl, and we now quote at 40¢. Dried Fruit—Peaches steady at 11¢. Beans—Firm and in demand. Corn Meal—In good demand. Sugar—In good demand.
